The Context:-

The College always aware that to form social activity among students and local social backward people. The main aim of this programme to aware educational development among social backward people. Indian society suffers from substantial inequalities in education, employment and income based on caste and ethnicity. The caste institution in our society is very effective. In this way 'Adivasis' had the lowest educational attainment than upper caste Hindus and other religious groups. Therefore constitution day was organized in local social backward people at Masanjogi Vasti for improving education among these peoples.

The Practice:-

Constitutional design has been treated as a kind of met game in which play consists of finding the best design provisions for the game of government, and that will be most likely to optimize a balance of the utilities of justice, liberty and security. The main objectives of social justice are compulsory and equal education, castles society and employment to each. Economic exploitation is also a big factor and all these do not allow the true realization of democracy. Evidence of Success:-

The College had organized constitution day on 26th Nov.2015 at Masanjogi vastii. e. social backward people. Many improvements have seen among these people.

2. Blood Donation Camp

Goals:-

- To encourage new people to donate their blood on voluntary unpaid basis.
- To create importance of blood donation among the student, staff members and also society.
- To build wider public awareness of the need for regular blood donation throughout the year in order to maintain an adequate supply of blood for all patients requiring transfusion.

The context:-

An integrated strategy for blood safety is required for the provision of safe and adequate blood. Recruiting a sufficient number of safe blood donors is an emerging challenge. The shortage of blood in India is due to an increase in the demand with fewer voluntary blood donors. A study on the knowledge attitude and the practice of donors may prove to be useful in the successful implementation of the blood donation programme. Our aim was to find the level of the knowledge attitude and practice of blood donation among voluntary blood donors.

The practice:-

Our college conducted blood donation camp on the occasion of Birth anniversary of Adarsh shikshan sanstha's secretary respected Jaydatt Kshirsagar on 7th Dec.2015. The theme of this programme is "Blood connects us all". It focused on thanking blood donors and highlights the dimension of "sharing" and connection between blood donors and patients. To draw attention to the roles that voluntary donation system played an encouraging people to care for one another and promote community cohesion. The campaign's aim is to highlight

stories of people whose lives have been saved through blood donation, as a way of motivating regular blood donors to continue giving blood and people in good health who have never given blood to begin doing so particularly young people.

Evidence of success:-

A majority of the donors were willing to be regular donors. The donors showed positive effect like a sense of satisfaction after a donation. Creating an opportunity for blood donation by conducting many blood donation camps may increase the voluntary blood donations.
